RULING

WINDER, J

- 1. This is my brief decision on the Plaintiffs' application that I essentially give an interlocutory judgment in their favor. They seek an Order that they "are entitled to their pension [benefits] from the date of their initial retirement."
- 2. The Plaintiffs' case was brought by Originating Summons dated 18 April 2018 seeking the payment of pension benefits as well as gratuity.
- 3. The Plaintiffs' case in the interlocutory application is based principally upon this Court having granted an Order in the case of another prison officer in *Culbert Evans v the Public Service Commission PUB/Con 0006/2018* dated 10th May, 2019. The Plaintiffs allege that Culbert Evans is a similar case to theirs. The Plaintiffs say that upon the true construction of certain letters, the provisions of the Pension Act and the *Culbert Evans Order* they are entitled to their pensions from 5th September, 2010 and 3rd May, 2011 respectively.
- 4. Whilst I recognise there must be some similarities with the *Evans* case, I am reluctant to make a summary determination as there were some admissions made in *Evans* which have not been forthcoming in this case. An interlocutory decision here will not determine all of the issues in this case. I am also mindful that the trial of this matter is set for July of this year when a decision could be had following a full trial dealing with all issues including issues of limitation.
- 5. In the circumstances I decline to make an interlocutory or summary order in favour of the Plaintiffs at this stage. I make no order as to costs.
